## Board Updates Sedan Limousine Definition

We adjusted the definition of sedan limousine to keep up with changes in vehicles that car-makers are producing. For example, the Lincoln Town Car and Cadillac DTS have been replaced by the slightly-smaller Lincoln MKS and Cadillac XTS. The new models do not meet the Board's minimum vehicle size standard that has been in place for the past decade.

The Board is introducing a minimum vehicle length option for 2012 model vehicles or newer. A vehicle must now meet the following criteria to be used as a sedan limousine:

- wheelbase of at least 113" (any model year) or overall length of at least 202" (2012 models or newer)
- 4 passenger doors
- closed body
- National Safety Mark or Compliance Label as a passenger car under the Canada Motor Safety Act

The definition of sedan limousine includes eco-friendly sedan limousine which is slightly smaller if certain criteria are met. Definitions are set out in the Board's Operational Policy IV.3, 'Sedan Limousines'.

We are making the adjustment after a number of limousine companies requested a policy change. The change gives the industry more vehicle options and preserves the distinction between sedan limousines and taxicabs.
